I actually stumbled upon it. I was out for an early morning bike ride in Charleston, SC when I came upon a public reading of the Declaration of Independence. Now, I will confess that I knew about this founding document. I had seen it in the National Archives in Washington, DC, but I don't think I had ever read it, and definitely had never heard it read out loud.

I stood there transfixed hearing this radical document! It really was/is an incredible statement of what led to the founding of our country, and a warning to us today. There are so many statements in it that are creeping

back into our society. I wonder if we are willing to confront them today as did our foreparents.

We are a people founded out of radicals! Not only as Americans, but as Moravians! July 6 is John Hus day. Hus was a professor in Prague who had this radical idea that everyone should be able to take communion and receive both the bread and the cup. Even more radical, he believed that everyone should be able to read the scripture in their native language! For these ideas he was burned at the stake!

I wonder how often we take Hus' beliefs for granted. We take communion without really thinking about it. We hear scripture read, but do we ever read it for ourselves? What if suddenly those freedoms were taken away?

This month I encourage you to consider the gifts of freedom we have. Read the Declaration of Independence. Listen to it read. (For many years the correspondents from NPR have read it. You can listen here. <u>https://www.npr.org/transcripts/128242656</u>) Read your Bible! If we are thinking of freedom, read Galatians and consider the freedom Christ gives.

Too often we take our freedom for granted, but it is a radical idea! It comes with a cost. As we are often reminded, freedom isn't free. May we consider the cost, and commit ourselves being worthy recipients of this amazing gift.
